MOTION FOR EXTENSION TO FILE PROTECTIVE ORDER

Weitech, Inc. ("Weitech"), through its undersigned counsel, moves pursuant to the Federal Trade Commission's Rules of Practice, 16 C.F.R. § 3.26, to extend the time by which Weitech, Inc. must file its motion for a protective order in the above-captioned matter.

In support of its motion, Weitech states:

- 1. During 2001, Weitech submitted documents regarding Lentek International, Inc. to the Federal Trade Commission, voluntarily in lieu of compulsory process, and with a confidential designation.
- 2. By letter dated October 1, 2002, Complaint Counsel in the instant matter notified counsel for Weitech that certain of the documents referenced in Paragraph 1 would be identified (and presumably produced) by Complaint Counsel as part of its Initial Disclosures in the instant matter. Complaint Counsel further notified counsel for Weitech that, pursuant to § 3.31 of the Commission's Rules of Practice, Weitech had until October 11, 2002 to file a motion for a protective order if warranted.
- 3. Counsel for Weitech has been informed that Complaint Counsel and Respondents' Counsel are negotiating a protective order governing discovery material for the

purpose of protecting the interests of the parties and third parties, presumably including Weitech, in this matter. The protective order would prohibit improper use and disclosure of confidential information submitted or produced in connection with this matter. The entry of such a protective order governing discovery material may adequately protect Weitech's interests in the documents that it voluntarily submitted to the Federal Trade Commission, thereby obviating the need for Weitech to file a motion for a protective order.

- 4. Weitech requests an order granting an extension of time until five business days after the effective date of any protective order governing discovery material to file a Motion for a Protective Order regarding documents referencing Lentek International, Inc. that Weitech voluntarily submitted to the Federal Trade Commission with a confidential designation. In the event that a protective order governing discovery material is not entered by November 1, 2002, Weitech requests an order granting an extension until November 8, 2002 to file a Motion for a Protective Order regarding documents referencing Lentek International, Inc. that Weitech voluntarily submitted to the Federal Trade Commission with a confidential designation.
 - 5. Complaint Counsel has informed movant that it has no objection to this motion.
- 6. Movant has not yet received a response from Respondents' Counsel to a similar request.

WHEREFORE, Weitech respectfully requests that this Motion be granted, and that the proposed Order Granting Extension to File Protective Order, attached hereto, be entered by the Administrative Law Judge.
