## ORDER ON APPLICATION FOR ISSUANCE OF SUBPOENAS

On April 24, 2009, Complaint Counsel, pursuant to Rule 3.34(a)(2) of the Commission's Rules of Practice, filed an application for the issuance of 23 subpoenas commanding persons to attend and give testimony at the adjudicative hearing in this matter. Respondent has not filed an opposition and the time for such filing has elapsed.

According to Complaint Counsel's brief description of the intended testimony of each individual, the testimony sought appears to be reasonably relevant. Complaint Counsel has represented that the requested subpoenas will be served at offices of the witness' counsel, place of business or personal address located in the United States.

This Order does not constitute a ruling on admissibility or whether the intended testimony from these individuals is cumulative. Pursuant to Rule 3.43 of the Commission's Rules of Practice, "[e]vidence, even if relevant, may be excluded . . . by considerations of undue delay, waste of time, or needless presentation of cumulative evidence." 16 C.F.R. § 3.43(b).

The application is GRANTED.
