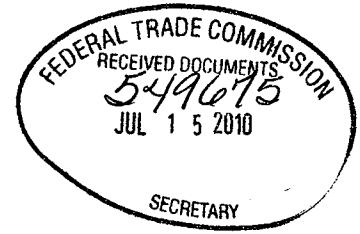


**ORDER ON JOINT SUBMISSION OF PARTIES
REGARDING COMPLAINT COUNSEL'S PRELIMINARY WITNESS LIST**

On July 6, 2010, the parties filed a Joint Submission of the Parties Regarding Respondent Dun & Bradstreet's July 1, 2010 Motion Regarding Complaint Counsel's Preliminary Witness List ("Joint Submission"). The Joint Submission stated the parties' negotiated resolution of that portion of Respondent's Motion which objected to Complaint Counsel's designating its preliminary witness list as confidential under the Protective Order issued in this case, and requested that an order be entered in accordance with the parties' agreement.

The Joint Submission is approved. In accordance with the Joint Submission, it is hereby ORDERED that:

1. Respondent may disclose the identity of employees of Market Data Retrieval ("MDR") and their testimony topics to anyone, without limitation;
2. With respect to third-party witnesses identified in Complaint Counsel's Preliminary Witness List (the "List"), Respondent may disclose to those third-parties that they have been so identified, and it may disclose the identities and designated testimony topics to in-house counsel for Respondent that are involved in the defense of this case, and to two businesspersons within Dun & Bradstreet whose identities shall be disclosed to Complaint Counsel at least one (1) day prior to the date of such disclosure; and
3. Respondent shall maintain the confidentiality of the List in all other respects in accordance with the terms of the Protective Order, and all individuals to whom disclosure is made as described in Paragraph 2 of this Order shall receive a copy of the Protective Order.
