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FANNIN REGIONAL HOSPITAL, TRINITY HOSPITAL OF AUGUSTA, AND FLOWERS HOSPITAL'S SECOND UNOPPOSED MOTION TO EXTEND THE DEADLINE TO FILE MOTION TO QUASH OR LIMIT SUBPOENAS DUCES TECUM

COME NOW non-parties Fannin Regional Hospital, Trinity Hospital of Augusta, and Flowers Hospital (collectively, the "Subpoena Recipients"), by and through the undersigned counsel, and, pursuant to Rules 3.22, 3.34(c) and 4.3(b) of the FTC Rules of Practice, hereby moves to further extend the deadline for moving to quash and/or limit, pursuant to FTC Rules of Practice 3.34(c), portions of the *Subpoenas Duces Tecum* served on the Non-Party Subpoena Recipients ("Subpoenas") by Respondents Phoebe Putney Health System, Inc., Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital, Inc., and Hospital Authority of Albany-Dougherty County (collectively, "Respondents"). This motion seeks a second, brief extension of the current deadline for filing such a motion through and including May 22, 2013. Counsel for the Respondents have been consulted regarding this motion and does not oppose the requested relief.

On or about April 26, 2013, Respondents served the Subpoenas on, among others, each of the Subpoena Recipients. Certain of the Subpoenas attached fifteen (15) categories of documents requested to be produced pursuant to the Subpoenas (the "Long Form"). The remaining Subpoenas attached four (4) categories of documents requested to be produced pursuant to the Subpoenas (the "Short Form"). The location of the Non-Party Subpoena Recipients and form of the Subpoenas received by each are summarized below:

Starting on May 2, 2013, and continuing through yesterday, May 16, 2013, counsel for, among others, the Subpoena Recipients conferred with counsel for the Respondents in a good faith effort to resolve objections to the Subpoenas.

On May 13, 2013, the Subpoena Recipients, along with 13 other recipients of Respondents' *Subpoenas Duces Tecum*, filed their Certain Non-Party Hospitals' Unopposed Motion to Extend the Deadline to File Motion to Quash or Limit *Subpoenas Duces Tecum*, seeking an extension of the deadline to file a motion to quash or limit Respondents' *Subpoenas Duces Tecum* through and including May 17, 2017. The extension was sought to facilitate further discussions among counsel in a good faith effort to resolve objections.

As of this filing, those discussions are continuing with respect to the Subpoena Recipients. However, as of the time of the filing of this Motion, a definitive agreement is not in place with the Respondents as to the scope of the Subpoenas. The only issues remaining

between Subpoena Recipients and Respondents are with respect to Short Form Request 3 and Long Form Request 9.

Accordingly, the Subpoena Recipients desire to further extend the current deadline to file a Motion to Quash and/or Limit the Subpoenas with respect to Short Form Request 3 and Long Form Request 9 through and including May 22, 2013, if necessary. This motion is not opposed by the Respondents. A proposed order granting the requested relief is attached hereto as Exhibit A.
