**ORDER GRANTING RESPONDENTS' MOTION
TO FURTHER ENLARGE TIME TO FILE ANSWERS**

By Order dated April 25, 2014, Respondent John Fanning and Respondent Jerk, LLC (collectively, "Respondents") were granted an extension of time for filing their Answers to the Complaint in this matter until May 5, 2014. On May 5, 2014, Respondents filed a Motion to Further Enlarge Time to File Answer ("Motion"). Respondents now seek another enlargement of the time in which to file their Answers from May 5, 2014 to May 19, 2014.¹


In support of the Motion, Respondents state that the parties have begun discussions aimed at possible resolution of this matter, but require additional time to continue the dialogue. Respondents state that an enlargement of time serves the interest of justice where a resolution could avoid additional cost and expense and preserve resources. Respondents further state that the limited extension should not unduly delay other procedural deadlines or the hearing date set for January 27, 2015. In addition, Respondents represent that the Federal Trade Commission ("FTC") Complaint Counsel assents to the Motion.

Based on the foregoing, good cause exists to grant the requested extension. 16 C.F.R. § 4.3(b). Accordingly, Respondent's Motion is GRANTED and it is hereby ORDERED that the

¹ Respondents state that they "request the Commission" to enlarge the time for filing their Answers. Pursuant to Federal Trade Commission ("FTC") Rule 3.22, with limited exceptions not applicable here, once a proceeding is pending before an Administrative Law Judge, all motions "shall be addressed to and decided by the Administrative Law Judge." 16 C.F.R. § 3.22(a).
