COMPLAINT COUNSEL'S MOTION AND MEMORANDUM FOR THE ISSUANCE OF SUBPOENAS AD TESTIFICANDUM FOR TRIAL UNDER RULE 3.36

Complaint Counsel respectfully move the Court for an order pursuant to Rule 3.36 for the issuance of the attached *subpoenas ad testificandum* to the nine employees of various county and city governments whom Complaint Counsel have included in its Final Proposed Witness List and whom Complaint Counsel currently intend to call to testify at trial. The testimony sought from these nine witnesses meets the requirements of Rule 3.36. Respondent has authorized Complaint Counsel to represent that Respondent does not oppose this motion.

Rule 3.36(b) of the Commission's Rules of Practice requires a party seeking issuance of a subpoena for the appearance at trial of an official or employee of a governmental agency to make a specific showing regarding the requested subpoena. For trial testimony, the noticing party must show that the testimony sought from the employee of the governmental agency is reasonable in scope.¹

The proposed *subpoenas ad testificandum* meet the requirements of Rule 3.36(b). The testimony sought from each of the nine witnesses will relate to Axon Enterprise's acquisition of

¹ The other requirements of Rule 3.36, applicable to subpoenas for depositions or for witnesses outside of the United States, are not applicable here because all nine of these trial witnesses reside in the United States.

VieVu from Safariland, including, *inter alia*, each police departments' needs, experiences, uses, options, supply, and procurement of BWC/DEMS, Requests for Proposals ("RFPs") issued, bids received in response to RFPs, agreements related to BWC/DEMS, competition in the BWC/DEMS market, and the impact of the acquisition on each department.² The scope of the testimony sought is limited to these and related topics. *See In the Matter Union Oil Company*, 2004 FTC LEXIS 256, FTC Docket No. 9305 (Order dated Dec. 7, 2004), *available at* https://www.ftc.gov/sites/default/files/documents/cases/2004/12/041207aljordrespmosubpadtest.

CONCLUSION

For the reasons stated above, Complaint Counsel respectfully request that the Court issue the attached *Subpoenas Ad Testificandum* to the nine employees of the county and city governments whom Complaint Counsel has included in its Final Proposed Witness List and whom Complaint Counsel currently intend to call to testify at trial.
