THIRD PARTY FREENOME HOLDINGS, INC.'S SECOND MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO MOVE FOR *IN CAMERA* <u>TREATMENT OF PROPOSED TRIAL EXHIBITS</u>

Pursuant to 16 C.F.R. §§ 3.22(f) and 4.3(b), Third Party Freenome Holdings, Inc.

("Freenome") respectfully requests an additional one-day extension of the August 5, 2021

deadline for filing motions for in camera treatment of proposed trial exhibits, as set in the

Administrative Law Judge's April 26, 2021 Scheduling Order, until Tuesday, August 10,

2021, for the reasons stated in the Supporting Memorandum below. As required by

16 C.F.R. § 3.22(c), a proposed Order accompanies this Motion.

Supporting Memorandum

Freenome previously moved for, and was granted, a four-day extension of the August 5, 2021 deadline for filing motions for *in camera* treatment of proposed trial exhibits by the Administrative Law Judge. Working with that new deadline in mind, Freenome was able to meet with its outside counsel to carefully review the documents designated by the parties as trial exhibits and to finalize the supporting declaration of its Chief Executive Officer, Michael Nolan. Both the declaration and the motion were signed and ready to be filed by counsel

during the evening of August 9, 2021. Counsel discovered, however, that the nonpublic exhibits (i.e., copies of the testimony and documents for which *in camera* treatment is being sought) did not have slip-sheets separating them or proper cover pages. As a result, it was necessary to use the morning of the next business day, August 10, 2021, to rectify these deficiencies and ensure that all the papers were in their proper order for filing.

As Freenome previously noted in its first motion, the testimony and documents designated by the parties as trial exhibits are voluminous. In addition to the transcripts, there are sixty separate exhibits for the Administrative Law Judge's review, and counsel had to divide up the nonpublic exhibits into six volumes to accommodate the file-size limits for electronic filing. The filing, as unwieldy as it was, has now been completed, and Freenome respectfully asks that the Administrative Law Judge excuse the additional small delay in getting the motion papers on file.

For the foregoing reasons, good cause exists for granting Freenome's Motion. Dated: August 10, 2021
