- 4 This is an initial prehearing conference in the
- 5 matter of Peabody Energy and Arch Coal, Docket Number
- 6 9391.
- 7 I just heard a weird beeping sound. Did
- 8 someone drop off the call? All right, this is Judge
- 9 Chappell. Can everyone hear me?
- 10 MR. LASKEN: Yes, Your Honor.
- MR. PERRY: Yes, Your Honor.
- 12 MR. HASSI: Yes, Your Honor.
- 13 JUDGE CHAPPELL: This prehearing conference is
- 14 being conducted telephonically and is being transcribed

- 6 MR. HASSI: Good afternoon, Your Honor. This
- 7 is Ted Hassi of Debevoise & Plimpton on behalf of
- 8 Respondent Peabody. I believe I'm the only person on
- 9 the line from Peabody.
- 10 JUDGE CHAPPELL: Mr. Hassi, welcome back.
- 11 MR. HASSI: Thank you, sir. It's good to be
- 12 here.
- 13 MR. PERRY: Good afternoon, Your Honor. This
- 14 is Michael Perry from Baker Botts on behalf of
- 15 Respondent Arch Coal. I believe I am the only person
- on the phone for Respondent Arch as well.
- 17 JUDGE CHAPPELL: Okay. Is that everyone?
- 18 My attorney-advisors are also on the line. At
- 19 the request of the court reporter, which is a very good
- 20 idea, I need everyone to mute your phones when you are
- 21 not speaking. And until the court reporter learns who
- 22 we are by voice, before anyone makes a statement, I
- 23 need you to identify yourself for the court reporter.
- 24 Susanne, do we need to do that for everyone or
- 25 do you think you'll recognize the voices?

- 2 I'd appreciate it if the others could.
- 3 THE COURT: All right. Everyone adhere to
- 4 that, please.
- 5 Let's begin. The transcript of this conference
- 6 may be made available to the public, so you're
- 7 instructed not to present any confidential information
- 8 in your overview.
- 9 There's currently a preliminary injunction
- 10 proceeding pending in the Federal District Court for
- 11 the Eastern District of Missouri, I believe. According
- 12 to the court docket, that hearing is scheduled to begin
- 13 Monday, on the 13th of July. I will need the parties
- 14 to keep us informed of any substantive decisions in
- 15 that case.
- 16 Would someone like to give me an update on
- 17 what's going on in that proceeding?
- 18 MR. HASSI: Yes, Your Honor. This is Ted Hassi
- 19 on behalf of Peabody.
- 20 As you've indicated, it's not just on the
- 21 docket, but we had a pretrial yesterday. We are going
- 22 forward with a ten-day preliminary injunction hearing
- 23 starting on Monday to run for ten consecutive days, so
- 24 through the 24th.
- 25 The Judge has set it for closing arguments on

- 1 the afternoon of August the 10th, and we hope to get a
- 2 decision relatively soon thereafter.
- JUDGE CHAPPELL: All right.
- 4 Do Complaint Counsel concur?
- 5 MR. LASKEN: Yes, Your Honor, Jonathan Lasken.
- 6 We concur.
- 7 JUDGE CHAPPELL: All right. The parties were
- 8 provided a draft scheduling order and provided joint
- 9 proposed changes to the dates to be consistent with the
- 10 new trial date. The parties' proposed changes are
- 11 acceptable, and I will incorporate them in an order I
- 12 will be issuing shortly.
- I trust the parties have attempted to settle
- 14 this matter. Who wants to provide the Court with a
- 15 status of settlement discussions?
- 16 MR. LASKEN: Your Honor, this is Jonathan
- 17 Lasken, counsel for the complaint. I'm happy to
- 18 provide that update, which is to say that there is no
- 19 settlement discussion ongoing, and I'm not aware of any
- 20 past offers that are still on the table or that merit
- 21 discussion.
- 22 JUDGE CHAPPELL: Well, that doesn't sound very
- 23 encouraging.
- 24 Mr. Hassi, have you got anything to say there?
- 25 MR. HASSI: Your Honor, I concur. We expect

- 2 in St. Louis by the judge, and we don't see any
- 3 prospect of a settlement short of that.
- 4 JUDGE CHAPPELL: So it's locked horns all the

- 7 JUDGE CHAPPELL: All right.
- 8 At this time I'll allow each side to make a
- 9 presentation limited to ten minutes. The Government
- 10 goes first.
- 11 MR. LASKEN: Thank you, Your Honor. This is
- 12 Jonathan Lasken, counsel for the complaint.
- 13 This case is about a joint venture between the
- 14 largest and second largest suppliers of coal from the
- 15 Southern Powder River Basin. Peabody is the largest
- 16 coal supplier in the Southern Powder River Basin and in
- 17 the United States. Arch --
- 18 JUDGE CHAPPELL: Hang on a second. The way you
- 19 worded that, the largest provider just in the Powder
- 20 River Basin or to the United States?
- 21 MR. LASKEN: Both. Both, Your Honor. So they
- 22 are both the largest in the Southern Powder River Basin
- 23 and the largest in the United States overall.
- JUDGE CHAPPELL: All right.
- MR. LASKEN: Arch is the second largest coal

- 1 supplier in the Southern Powder River Basin and they
- 2 are also the second largest in the United States. The
- 3 combined entity would control more than 60 percent of
- 4 Southern Powder River Basin coal production and
- 5 reserves.
- 6 Complaint Counsel contends the product market
- 7 in this case is the sale of Southern Powder River Basin
- 8 coal and that the geographic market is the Southern
- 9 Powder River Basin. There is a strong presumption of
- 10 illegality in this case with HHIs many times more than
- 11 the threshold, and there is strong evidence that
- 12 head-to-head competition between Peabody and Arch will
- 13 be lost with no significant countervailing factors.
- I provide that as a very high-level statement
- 15 because I understand that Mr. Hassi intends to waive
- 16 his statement. I am prepared to provide further detail
- 17 and speak for the ten minutes if you would like, Your
- 18 Honor, but I am also prepared to leave it at that in
- 19 light of that understanding, whatever the Court would
- 20 prefer.
- 21 JUDGE CHAPPELL: Let's first check with
- 22 Mr. Hassi.
- You're waiving your overview?
- MR. HASSI: Yes, Your Honor. In light of the
- 25 fact that, as we've previously discussed -- and I

- 1 should have said this is Ted Hassi speaking -- in light
- 2 of the fact that we have a preliminary injunction
- 3 hearing happening starting on Monday and that we expect
- 4 a decision well before the trial of this case, and the

- 6 that we expect that her decision -- that the parties
- 7 will abide by her decision. If she decides against the
- 8 joint venture, we will abandon it.
- 9 And so we don't anticipate that -- while we
- 10 think we will be vindicated in that case and that the
- 11 FTC will hopefully follow its past practice and not
- 12 proceed with an administrative proceeding after losing
- in federal court, we don't anticipate that we will be
- 14 presenting this case to Your Honor.
- 15 And so rather than waste Your Honor's time this
- 16 afternoon -- I'm obviously happy to answer any
- 17 questions Your Honor has -- but we're going to forgo an
- 18 opening statement at this time or a preliminary
- 19 statement at this time.
- JUDGE CHAPPELL: All right, that sounds good.
- 21 Of course, it's optional.
- With that, do I have anything further from
- 23 either side?
- MR. LASKEN: Nothing, Your Honor.
- MR. HASSI: Nothing from Respondents, Your
